Uniform Policy

We are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of our children and expect all staff to share this commitment. Our Safeguarding and PREVENT policies are integral to all other policies and practice and form part of our school life. Our aim is to ensure our children are safe at all times.

At Stanstead Nursery & Primary, we believe that school uniform is important and plays a valuable role in contributing to the learning ethos of our school. We also believe that it:

- Contributes to a feeling of pride within our school
- Looks smart and gives a sense of belonging for the children
- Is practical and distinctive
- Identifies the children with our school
- eliminates social problems caused by the latest fashion trends

We are committed to promoting equality and ensuring that no child is discriminated against due to their religion, belief, economic circumstances, or social and cultural background.

Our uniform has been chosen to be smart, practical, and good value for money.

School fleeces, cardigans and jumpers can be bought from school; however, plain jumpers can also be purchased at a reasonable price at local shops, including our local Tesco.

Our school colours are: Royal blue, Black/Grey and white, complimented by our yellow school logo.

All children need:

- royal blue crew neck sweatshirt/sweatshirt cardigan (with or without school logo)
- Optional royal blue Stanstead zip fleece
- white/light blue shirt/polo shirt
- grey/black school trousers/skirt/pinafore dress/shorts
- optional blue gingham summer dress
- grey/white/black plain socks or grey/black tights
- black flat sensible school shoes (shoes are to be plain with no coloured logos)

- blue Stanstead book bag

For PE all children need:

- Plain white T-shirt
- Navy/black PE shorts or track-suit bottoms (not leggings)
- plimsolls/trainers

On days when pupils have PE, they can come to school in their PE kit. No football tops, shorts or other branded clothing should be worn on PE days.

PE Kit should be worn for After School sporting clubs.

Jewellery, Hair & Makeup

Please find below details of our Health & Safety:

- Long hair should be tied back during P.E
- No nail polish or make-up should be worn at school
- Jewellery should not be worn at school, at all times, in order to maintain their health & safety. The exception is for a plain pair of gold/silver small stud earrings and watches (not smartwatches). No other jewellery is allowed due to health & safety and liability in case of loss.
- Hair should be of a natural colour; long hair must be tied back for PE and items used to secure hair must be plain.

If you would like your child to have their ears pierced, please try to arrange this at the start of the summer holidays so they have enough time to heal. This means

earrings can be removed for PE. Earrings cannot be worn for PE lessons- plasters are not allowed to be worn over earrings for PE.

Bags

School bags should be able to carry items that the children need for school e.g reading book, water bottle etc.

All clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name. This is especially important, as uniform items look similar and can easily be confused for another child's. The school cannot accept responsibility for any lost items.

Role of the Class Teachers and Support Staff

- Set a good example in terms of dress.
- Remember that in our respective roles we serve the local community as a set of professionals.
- To remind children to wear school uniform. The class teacher will speak to children who do not wear the correct uniform. If they still are not wearing the uniform they are to be referred to the Head of School.
- Issue a polite reminder to parents in the first instance.

Role of the Headteacher

- The Headteacher is to ensure that pupils comply with the uniform policy agreed by the governing body.
- The Headteacher has a duty to enforce the school uniform throughout the school community, as part of the duty within the maintenance of day-to-day discipline in the school.
- The Headteacher will speak to the parents of children who persistently do not wear the correct uniform.

Role of the Parents/Carers

- To ensure that their child/ren adheres to the school's uniform policy.
- Ensure that they come to school in uniform every day unless there are special circumstances such as non-uniform days.
- To ensure that all uniform is labelled correctly and clearly.
- To understand that if you send your child to Stanstead you adhere to their policy on uniform.
